<p>AΩ – Alpha & Omega, the beginning and the end Amen – “so be it” anointed – smeared w/ oil; “appointed” bridegroom – the groom → Christ Cardinal Virtues > principal or “pivotal” virtues that uphold a moral life Catholic – universal “Catholic” = the church Cathedral – seat of the Bishop Catechism – instruction in Christian principles Chi Rho – Greek for “ChRist” (C+P) Confirmation – sacrament to complete the baptismal grace/ fully join the Church concupiscence – our tendency to sin creation/ creature – all that is created by God; only God exists before creation</p>	<p>Emmanuel – Hebrew name for “God is with us” eschatological –the end of times idolatry – putting something above God invention – not created, but discovered by man justification – becoming righteous (or right by) before God laity – the people (not “religious” people, priests/nuns) liturgy / liturgical – public celebration; the Mass Magisterium – the fullness of the Church and her teachings Messiah – “anointed one” =Christ oblation – sacrifice/ offering parochial – having to do w/ a parish paschal – Easter/ or having to do w/ Easter</p>	<p>Penitence – sorrow for sin/doing wrong Pious – devoted, reverent Propitiate – to atone/ make amends Repent – to regret & turn away from sin Righteous – right before God sacred / sacrament – holy, set apart testament – covenant, agreement w/ God; the two major books of the Bible The Way - = early name for Christians Typology – way of seeing Christ and New Testament in the Old Testament through “types” or partial examples of Venial – not moral, bad but not so bad (“not grave matter”)</p>

Term	Your Definition (in class exercise)	Fixed Definition (homework)
<i>Amen</i>		“So be it”, meaning “I agree”; comes from Hebrew “amen” for “truth”, thus affirms truth
Christ		“The Messiah” which means “the Anointed One”; Christ’s divine mission is to save us from our sins
Covenant		Agreement between God and man with mutual commitments and guarantees
INRI		<i>INRI = Iesus Nazarenus, Rex Iudaeorum</i> Latin initials for “Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews”
idolatry		Rejection of God and putting anything before or above him
Jesus		“God saves”
Mass		Eucharistic service or celebration; “mass” means “mission” or “to go forth”, as in to spread the Good News of Christ
“Peace be with you”		The Lord’s greeting to the Apostles after Resurrection, granting them his peace; also indicates the Holy Spirit
sin		an offense against God
Sacrament		“a visible sign of the hidden reality of salvation” and “a sign of Grace”
Trinity		The unity of God in the three persons of the Father, Son & Holy Spirit
