- Big Ideas:

- English and Spanish have common origins
- English is crazy!
- English learning:

From the ear >> to the mouth >> to the brain

(Desde el >> del oído hasta la boca >> hasta el cerebro)

III. Getting to know English

- See handout “Conocer el inglés”
- English spelling is complicated due to the multiple origins of English (Celtic, Anglo-Saxon, French, Latin, Greek, etc.)
(La ortografía inglesa es complicada debido a los múltiples orígenes del inglés (celta, anglosajón, francés, latín, griego, etc.)
- That is why English has many “synonyms” (similar meaning) and “homophones” (sound the same, spell differently)
(Es por eso que el inglés tiene muchos "sinónimos" (significado similar) y "homófonos" (suenan igual, se escriben de manera diferente)
- We also discussed last week how English has extra vowel sounds, called “diphthongs”
(También discutimos la semana pasada cómo el inglés tiene sonidos vocálicos adicionales, llamados "diptongos")
